Jersey shore singer/songwriter veteran BOB BURGER debuts NEW electric line-up at Wonder Bar, Asbury Park, NJ on Saturday, January 28 at 10PM.

NEW JERSEY (PHANTOM POWER PRODUCTIONS) January 12, 2006 – Referring back to his early style and role as musical director BOB BURGER debuts a *new* full electric line-up at Wonder Bar, 1213 Ocean Avenue, Asbury Park, New Jersey on Saturday, January 28 at 10PM. Joining BURGER at Wonder Bar on lead guitar is Jimmy Leahey of The Alice Project), Steve Shewchuck on bass guitar and Joe Bellia on drums, both of Southside Johnny and The Asbury Jukes and the Bobby Bandiera Band. Doors, 9PM; cover \$5.00.

BOB BURGER began his live performance career as a band leader and musical director and only started playing a supporting guitar and vocal role after joining the Bobby Bandiera Band in the late 1980's. While playing out in acoustic environments in support of his debut CD, Cymbals At Dawn, BURGER has returned to his frontman form; lacking, however, an electric line-up behind him.

The Wonder Bar date will mark only the second time that BURGER has fronted his own electric line-up on the Jersey Shore, the first having come last summer when BURGER filled in for regular Sunday night entertainer Bobby Bandiera at The Columns in Avon-by-the-Sea. This performance comes with a new line-up for BURGER, however. Jimmy Leahey the son of jazz great Harry Leahey, has toured with Patty Smythe, Marshall Crenshaw, Phoebe Snow, John Waite and Styx's Glen Burtnik, and turned down an offer from Blood, Sweat & Tears to become a member of The Alice Project. Jimmy Leahey is also often seen as half of BURGER'S acoustic duo that plays the Celtic Cottage in Long Branch every Thursday night. Steve Shewchuck, known best to Southside Johnny fans as "Muddy Shews," may have the most versatile musical background of the band. Having started out with Dramarama in the 80's bringing experience in classical piano, Shewchuck evolved into Rock and Roll, and back through the underbelly of straight ahead blues and honest R&B. Finally, Joe Bellia, photographer-by-day who's credited with the Cymbals At Dawn artwork, got his start playing with such musicians as Dave Mason and Cyndi Lauper.

With an extremely loyal local fan following anticipation is brewing over what can be expected from this band. Most of BURGER'S audience has experienced many of these players in one facet or another, but never all together. Renowned for his strong vocals and rock hard acoustic delivery, there is also much speculation regarding the set list.

"(The setlist) will feature tunes that I do acoustically, however, I'll be selective of those that work in a dance bar setting," reports BURGER.

Compared to the venues BOB BURGER plays regularly, Wonder Bar provides a bigger, better opportunity for incorporating a "wow" factor into his set. Often BURGER is quieted by volume limitations in formal dining establishments or audio limitations inherent in mixing for small bars. At Wonder Bar BURGER will be able to showcase his ability to fill a room, engage a larger audience, and communicate his talents as frontman and musical director.
